Godmother of all living...

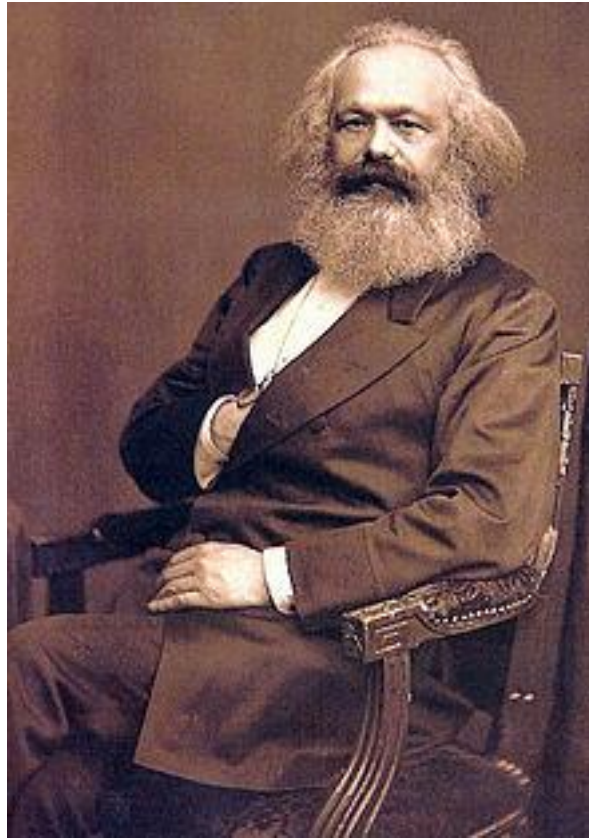
**From these two waters, Lahmu and Lahamu
